

A WELCOME TO SALFORD RED DEVILS

Our thoughts return to Super League, this evening, as St. Helens face Salford Red Devils, for the second time this season. This is certain to be a very emotional occasion, as; at long last, we can welcome a limited number of spectators back into The Totally Wicked Stadium, to cheer on the Saints. For the record, supporters were last present at a Saints 'home' fixture, 14 long months ago, on 6 March 2020, when Huddersfield Giants were our visitors; with all matches since, played behind closed doors. Even though only 'home' supporters will be present tonight, hopefully this will be a major stepping-stone towards returning to a degree of relative normality on, or after 21 June 2021.

Tonight's encounter is also a repeat of the opening match of this season, when St. Helens defeated the Red Devils by 29 points to 6, in a Saints 'home' game, played at Headingley, Leeds. Salford were also Saints' visitors on the opening weekend of last season, in a game the Saints won 48-8. For the record, in the return fixture in October, Salford's 'home' match verses Saints was also played at, Headingley, Leeds; with the hosts defeating a somewhat under strength St Helens by 12 points to 10. This loss went along way to ending Saints' hopes of clinching the League Leaders' Shield for a third successive year.

After five Super League XXVI rounds, Saints come into tonight's game at the top of the league having won all five of their matches. Salford have won just one; and are, at present, sitting in 10th position in the League with two points.

There were many changes at Salford during the off season, with the club having seen 11 departures from last year's squad and 10 new recruits. Out go several familiar faces that helped the Red Devils reach the 2019 Super League Grand Final and the 2020 Challenge Cup Final, with Niall Evalds, Kris Welham, Gil Dudson, Joey Lussick, Tyrone McCarthy and Mark Flanagan no longer at the club. In come the likes of Morgan Escare, Joe Burgess, Matty Costello, Dec Patton, Darcy Lussick and Elijah Taylor.

But their biggest loss was arguably their Head Coach, lan Watson who has moved across the Pennines to Huddersfield Giants. Ian had completely transformed the Salford Red Devils; brought stability to the club and oversaw Salford's journey from the Million Pound Game to the Grand Final. Just how big of a loss, Watson's departure is, will depend on the success of former Saints Assistant Coach, Richard Marshall, who became a Head Coach in Super League, for the very first time.

Marshall did a great job at Halifax and he has earned many plaudits for his work with the St. Helens squad, as Assistant Coach, under both Justin Holbrook and Kristian Woolf. Whilst at Saints, the club won back-to-back Super League Grand Finals and Richard played an integral part in those successes.

Richard's links with Saints again adds a bit of sparkle to tonight's fixture. He knows a lot about St. Helens and Saints know a fair bit about him. As time progresses, I'm sure Marshall's appointment will be seen as an inspired choice, as his new squad evolves under his leadership. He has already made slight adjustments to how the Red Devils play and after a rather slow start to the season, there is no doubt that they are now improving with each game they play.

Salford looked fresh in their pre-season run out verses Wigan Warriors and they thoroughly deserved their impressive 20 points to 6 win. They opened their Super League campaign with two heavy losses at the hands of Saints (A*) 6-29 and Hull FC (H*) 4-35. Their first win, under Marshall, was a comfortable 68 points to 4, Challenge Cup, 2nd Round, triumph over, Championship team, Widnes Vikings (H) and that was followed by a thumping at the hands of the Catalans (A) 6-42.

A much better performance, against Leigh Centurions (H) in their fourth Super League run out led to the Red Devils first win; in a 38-8 triumph, and they were highly competitive and, a little unfortunate, against Castleford Tigers (H) the following week finally going down to a 18-28 loss. Last weekend's run out against Castleford Tigers (A*) in the Quarter Final of the Challenge Cup was much closer; and for long periods of pulsating encounter, Salford were the better team. Sadly though, they lost in the cruellest manner; when Gareth O'Brien, a former Red Devil, landed a 'Golden Point', Extra Time, drop goal to win the game by 19 points to 18 for the Tigers.

Salford have faced Saints on 49 occasions since the onset of Super League. Saints have won 42 of these previous Super League meetings between the sides, including all 14 matches played at Knowsley Road, one at the Stobart Stadium, nine at the Totally Wicked Stadium; including the Grand Opening game in 2012, and this season's earlier clash at Headingley, Leeds. In this period, St. Helens have also defeated Salford 23-6 in the 2019 Super League Grand Final and have won each of the three Challenge Cup ties between the two teams. For the record, St. Helens have won their last 37 home matches versus the Red Devils. Salford's last win in St. Helens was, 41 years ago, by 18 points to 17 back on the 12th January, 1980.



DAN SARGINSON

Dan joined the Red Devils from Wigan Warriors at the start of the 2020 season. A hardworking centre; who can also cover at full-back, he made try-scoring debut for Harlequins RL in May 2011 and went on to play 50 games for London prior to joining Wigan in 2014. During his first spell with the Warriors, Dan was Grand Finalist in 2014 and became a Super League Champion, two years later. An England international in 2014 & 2016; he joined Gold Coast Titans in the NRL ahead of 2017 for Wigan ahead of the 2018 campaign. A Super League Champion for a second time in 2018, Dan left the Warriors at the end of 2019 and has now made 14 appearances for Salford.



RHYS WILLIAMS

Rhys Williams, also known as "Dragon", was born in Wales. Starting out with Warrington Wolves in 2010 he played 29 times scoring 21 tries. He spent time out on loan with Crusaders, Castleford Tigers and Salford before leaving the club to play in Australia for Central Queensland Cabras. Williams returned to the UK in 2015 signing for the London Broncos and he went onto play 154 games, scoring 100. Rhys is a prolific try score and with 29 appearances and 22 tries to his he is also a proven performer on the international stage with Wales. He rejoined the Salford Red Devils in 2020 and he has gone on to score a further seven tries in 20 appearances for the club.



KEN SIO

Ken Sio, aged 30, made his NRL debut for the Parramatta Eels in the final round of matches in 2011. He quickly became a regular in the Eels' ranks and in four years with the club, he appeared 57 times and scored 37 times. Predominantly a winger, he is equally at home at full back and in the centres. He joined Hull KR in Super League in 2015 and scored 37 times and 58 tries and 13 goals for the Robbins in his 61 matches, before moving back to the NRL; signing for Newcastle Knights. In his two seasons at the Knights, Sio again impressed and he went to make a further 41 appearances and scored 17 tries and 25 goals. In 2019 he joined Salford in 33 game jorned Salford and in 33 game for the club he has scored 23 tries and



LEE MOSSOP

Lee Mossop is 32 years of age and hails from Hensingham in Cumbria. A hard running forward, Lee made his debut for Wigan Warriors back in 2008 in a Challenge Cup tie. He enjoyed six years with the Warriors making 110 appearances for the club, scoring six tries, and he also spent short periods out on loan with Barrow Raiders and Huddersfield Giants. During his first stint at Wigan, Lee was a Super League Champion in 2013 and a Challenge Cup winner in 2011 & 2013. An England international in 2012 & 2013, he moved to the NRL, ioining Parramatta Eels in 2014. Having made just three appearances with the Eels he rejoined Wigan 12 months later and in two further years with the Warriors, he played in a further 55 matches and scored seven tries. Lee moved to Salford in 2017 and has gone on to make 72 appearances, scoring six tries



PAULI PAULI

Pauli Pauli joined the Red Devils from Wakefield Trinity at the start of the 2020 season. During 2019, he spent a month on loan at Salford, scoring three tries in three sub appearances for the club. A huge man, Pauli Pauli, was a 'cult hero' at Trinity. The 6ft 4, 19 stone prop settled in well after arriving from Newcastle Knights in the NRL. Having previously played for the Parramatta Eels and NSW City, he scored 10 tries in his 15+31 games for Trinity. He plays the game with a smile on his face and has become a fans' favourite at the club. With 22 further appearances to his name and two further tries, Pauli Pauli was also a member of Salford's team that were narrowly defeated in last season's Challenge Cup Final.





A LOOK BACK IN TIME FROM OUR CLUB HISTORIAN

FOR ENGLAND AND ST GEORGE

The gradual, sad demise of the St. Helens Recreation team just before the Second World War enabled the Saints, their fierce local rivals, to sign budding young half-back star Frank Tracey with money partly donated by Saints' Supporters Club. They signed the fearsome front-rower George Davies round about the same time, from Liverpool Stanley using the same financial assistance. Ironically, Frank became an England international soon after his transfer, when the French came to play against England at Knowsley Road, probably much to the disdain of Recs' supporters, who thought that Saints had got quite a bargain. He was considered to be a real match-winner at City Road and the St. Helens Reporter carried the following information about the move:

"Frank Tracey, aged just twenty, who signed for Saints rugby club on Tuesday, was brought up within a few yards of the ground at City Road where he began his career in senior rugby football. As a boy he was a particularly clever boxer and also figured brilliantly in the Lowe

House rugger team. His real position is scrumhalf, although he has figured as centre and outhalf with distinction. His height is 5ft 6ins and he turns the scales at 10st 4lbs. One feature of his play is his splendid ball distribution, but his trump card is a sudden acceleration in individual bursts which marks him apart from the ordinary player. There are times when he weaves his way through the ranks of the whole team. If given protection by the loose forward against crushing work by out-sized forwards he should have a brilliant career."

The international, on Saturday 25th February 1939, attracted a crowd of over 10,000, many of whom had come to watch Tracey, who became the 272nd player to represent his country. It was an end-to-end encounter, with the French winning their first match on English soil 9-12. Frank Tracey in his earlier days represented St Helens Schoolboys who lifted the Lancashire Cup in 1931-32. He is pictured sitting cross-legged on the left. Frank made a second international appearance during the war and later joined Wigan, after 80 matches and 30 tries for the Saints. A good 'un!
